
You've Got Their Backs

EXAMPLES OF THE IMPORTANT PTSA INVOLVEMENT WITHIN THE ISSAQUAH SCHOOL DISTRICT

- In the District-wide Reflections Program with the theme of "The World Would Be A Better Place If...", we had more than 1,000 entries and of those entries:
 - o 268 entries advanced to the Regional level,
 - o 68 entries advanced to the State level,
 - o 11 entries advanced to the National level,
 - 3 entries placed at Nationals
- Teacher Appreciation events were held at 27 different schools (all schools in the district) including Tiger Mountain and Echo Glen.
- There were 54 PTSA-sponsored Parent Education events held during this year throughout the Issaquah School District.
- Over 1,000,000 (yes, that's one MILLION!) hours were volunteered during the year throughout the Issaquah School District to support programs sponsored by the PTSA.
- Over 17,000 kids were reached throughout the Issaquah School District through PTSA funds or volunteer hours.
- Over \$1.5 million was invested in the students, their families, and the schools in the Issaquah School District.
