Season's Greetings from the Beaver Lake Library!

Did you know that your student has access to 15 fabulous databases from the Beaver Lake Library website? These databases are great tools for research in all subject areas including science, history, current events, biography and more. One of the first things that I teach students in the library is the difference between a database and a search engine. Both are great tools, but a database is the better resource for the research your students will be doing in middle school and beyond. A couple definitions:

A **database** is a collection of related information (data) organized for convenient access. Think of a database as a giant encyclopedia with articles, primary and secondary sources, news articles, books, videos and more that is constantly curated and updated. A database is a reliable and accurate resource and can be trusted to be objective and well-researched.

A **search engine** like Google or Bing can be useful in searching key words and phrases but students need to wade through many irrelevant hits and be careful to evaluate search results for accuracy, bias, timeliness, etc.

You can try out the BLMS databases from the library website at <u>www.tinyurl.com/BLMSlibrary</u> Look for "Databases for Research" on the left of the page. You will need a username and password for home access. These usernames and passwords are listed on page 29 of your student's planner and students also have a sticker with this information in their binder. Or you can use the "Access Databases From Home" link by logging onto Connect.

The next time you see your student Google-ing for research, ask if he or she has tried using a database first!
