It's Grant Season! All teachers, administrators and parents within the Issaquah School District can apply for a grant. Grants were how the Issaquah Schools Foundation got started in 1987. It was a response to inadequate state funding and the community's desire to ensure our students received the best possible education. The goal is to offer funding opportunities to pilot innovative solutions and, where possible, to leverage those solutions across the district so every student may benefit.

There are 2 types of grants: 1) Classroom Enrichment Grants (up to \$1,000) and 2) Kateri Brow* Big Idea/Biggest Need Grants (up to \$10,000) (*named in honor of our late Superintendent). Here is the grant timeline:
