

Three newly released non-fiction books that I'm excited about this month:

- A Storm Too Soon: A Aemarkable True Survival Story in 80-foot Seas by Mike Tougias: Following on the success of last year's book The Finest Hours: The True Story of a Heroic Sea Rescue, Tougias' new book tells the amazing story of the 2007 rescue of the crew of 47 foot sailboat trapped in a lifeboat in the middle of a disastrous storm in the Gulf. This true story reads like a thriller!
- Ghosts in the Fog: The Untold Story of Alaska's WWII Invasion by Samantha Seiple: Seiple's book tells the little known story of the invasion of the Aleutian Islands. Told from the point of view of several individuals involved in the struggle, this is a gripping story. Just learning about the unusual battle conditions about which the book is titled—the ghosts in the Fog—was compelling!
- Bleed, Blister, Puke and Purge: The Dirty Secrets Behind Early American Medicine by J. Marin Younker: The title alone will appeal to many middle schoolers! This book explores the history of early medical practices—successful and not so much. Told with a bit of humor, this entertaining book is great for students who like a bit of blood and guts in their reading diet!




