Hello from the Beaver Lake Library!

Signs of spring at BLMS: the cherry blossoms in bloom outside our building, track season is about to start and many classes are starting research projects in the library! The three steps to research that I teach your students are:

#### 1. Pre-Research:

- a. Orient yourself to the topic using a general information source (Wikipedia is great for this) to get a general overview about your topic. This should only take 5 minutes or so to get a sense for what the topic is about. For example, an eighth grader assigned to research the *Texas v. Johnson* Supreme Court decision would quickly learn that this case is a 1<sup>st</sup> Amendment case that had to do with the constitutionality of flag burning. Knowing this general information will then help direct research in step 2.
- b. Look at your assignment and determine exactly WHAT information you need to know about your topic. This will help you to organize your notes and direct your research efforts.
- 2. **Dig In**: We have access to some AMAZING subscription-based databases available to our students. While students are using the internet to access the databases, they are not doing a Google search for information. Databases are the modern version of encyclopedias—curated, on-line information collections—that include reference articles, news and magazine articles, biographical information, videos and links to other resources. Parents, if you would like to see a database ask your student to show you. Students know how to access the databases from the library website and the usernames and passwords needed to do so from home.
- 3. **Cite Your Sources**: Most database articles have the citations done for students, but we have information on how to format a works cited list (bibliography) available on the library website under the "Writing Standards" tab.

I love having the opportunity to help your students with their research! Knowing how to access, assess and use information is a skill that will help them in school and beyond.
