As a PTSA Board, we are also very excited about ParentWiser. We recognize the need for our parents to stay updated with current and relevant information, and ParentWiser does just that. Also in the news, The Issaquah School Board approved a two-year Educational Programs and Operations (EP&O) levy to be placed on the February 2018 ballot at a special public meeting held Monday, Nov. 27. If approved by voters, the EP&O levy would authorize the District to collect \$81.2 million over a two-year period, replacing the levy that expires on Dec. 31, 2018. Looking for Volunteers for Hour of Code

What is the Hour of Code?

The Hour of Code started as a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. It has since become a worldwide effort to celebrate computer science, starting with 1-hour coding activities but expanding to all sorts of community efforts. This grassroots campaign is supported by over 400 partners and 200,000 educators worldwide.

When is the Hour of Code?

The Hour of Code takes place each year during Computer Science Education Week. The 2017 Computer Science Education Week will be December 4-10, but you can host an Hour of Code all year round. Computer Science Education Week is held annually in recognition of the birthday of computing pioneer Admiral Grace Murray Hopper (December 9, 1906).

BLMS Hour of Code will be in the Library on December 6, 2017 from 9am-10am.

Students generally work independently through the modules on the Hour of Code website, but it is great to have a few adults to help troubleshoot!

Thank you also for your purchase of Jack Gantos' book, *Writing Radar: Using Your Journal to Snoop Out and Craft Great Stories* for each of our LA teachers. This is a great book for middle school students about the craft of writing and is really funny! For example, when Gantos explains the elements of the writing process in chapter 17, he uses his own experiences as a middle schooler with a dubious neighbor, a human catapult, riding a bicycle off a roof and his childhood tendency to be drawn to dangerous people! This might be my favorite nonfiction purchase for 2017.

Something Jack Gantos emphasizes again and again in his book is that great writers are great READERS! If you are looking for ways to motivate your child to read check out this article from Common Sense Media: https://www.commonsensemedia.org/blog/how-to-motivate-a-middle-school-reader There are some great suggestions for parents here! Among the suggestions from this article is to "Let them choose what they read" for their choice reading. This is so important! If it's graphic novels or Sports Illustrated or Harry Potter for the 50th time that's ok! As long as your child is reading, he or she is building the reading muscles that will prepare him or her for high school and college!




